Spectronics is proud to certify, in accordance with section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, that its products are manufactured with metals derived from materials that are **DRC Conflict-Free**.

We are committed to maintaining this certification through a process of monitoring and verification of our sources through the use of the template developed by the "EICC (Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition and GeSI (Global e-Sustainability Initiative)."
